MESCALERO APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

NOTICE: CLASS II – MODERATE FIRE DANGER RESTRICTIONS

EFFECTIVE : August 12, 2023 (Until rescinded or superseded)

CLASS II - FIRE RESTRICTIONS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

No restrictions in place for burning of organic slash piles. A courtesy call to the BIA Branch of Wildland Fire Management (575-464-4419) and Mescalero Fire and Rescue (575-464-3473) is requested prior to ignition.

No restrictions in place for campfires, charcoal grills, and wood-burning stoves. Ensure ashes are cold and out. Dwellings with fireplaces or wood burning (cooking or heating) stoves shall have proper screens installed to prevent the escape of burning embers (homeowner's responsibility).

Smoking outdoors permitted, if extinguished in a proper container.

Chainsaws and other internal or external combustion engines must always be equipped with a properly functioning spark arrestor.

Fireworks of any kind are never permitted.

These restrictions are a reflection of current wildland fire hazard conditions on the Mescalero Apache Indian Reservation and are being implemented for public safety. The above restrictions will remain in effect until rescinded under authority of Mescalero Apache Tribal Resolution No. 09-59. Personnel exempt from the above restrictions include Federal and Tribal employees, such as Tribal Resource Managers and Bureau of Indian Affairs Employees while in the performance of their official duties. These restrictions will be enforced by the Branch of Law Enforcement Services and the Tribal Conservation Department under authority Title 18, Sections 1855 and 1856 USC and Tribal Statutes 10-5-4, 10-5-5, 10-5-6, 17-12-3 through 17-12-5 and 17-18-1.

How does tribal child support work?

Child Support refers to payments one parent makes to their child's other parent or legal guardian to help with the costs of raising the child.

Here are the services our tribal child support program provides:

- Find the other parent: We can try to find the other parent to establish parentage and a support order.
- Establish parentage: We can help parents establish a legal relationship with their child through a quick and easy form or genetic testing.
- Establish and enforce a support order: We can
 establish an order that provides support for your child.
 When the other parent doesn't pay the full amount or
 doesn't pay at all, we can use enforcement options like
 withholding child support from their paycheck.
- Review or modify the order: We can review your order and, if appropriate, modify it based on a change in income or circumstances.

Our program also has culturally specific elements:

- Cultural understanding: Our program knows the community and works to help children financially, emotionally, and holistically. We can make referrals to community and culturally-based programs.
- Hands on experience: We're uniquely positioned to walk you through our tribal child support process and family-centered approach.



Tribal programs provide services to Native American families consistent with tribal values and cultures. The programs find parents, establish legal fatherhood (paternity), and set and enforce child support orders.

Here are some FAQ MATCSEO gets asked on a regular.

- How does Custodial parents receive payments? All CP's (Custodial Parents) will receive a check in their name. When we receive a payment, it is processed within our office and mailed out. If the payment is in the form of a Money Order, then it is submitted to the MAT Accounting Dept. so that a tribal check can be issued. This is an assurance measure. If a tribal check was lost in the mail or damaged, we can have the Accounting Department put a stop to that check and have it reissued which our office is unable to do with a Money Order. All payments are mailed; therefore, we ask for CP's to update their addresses as soon as possible.
- Who do I make the money order out to? Please make all money orders out to MATCSEO. We do not accept
 personal checks. Payments can be submitted to the MATCSE office directly or mailed to PO BOX 300,
 MESCALERO NM 88340
- What is an IWO? Income Withholding Order. When the MAT Court orders child support, MATCSEO will issues a Notice to Withhold to the employer of the paying parent(NCP). The IWO will list a specific amount of current child support and arrears payment that is to be withheld from the paying parent's(NCP) wages each month in accordance with their child support order.
- Where is your office located? We are located at 454 Lipan Avenue, Mescalero NM 88340, between the Care Center and Elderly Building, in the old assisted living area. Please call 575-464-2577 if needing more directions.
- How long does it take to get child support established? The time frame for MATCSEO to get an Order to Establish Child Support varies on serval actions. The most important thing is to have cooperation from the involved parties. Once MATCSEO receives an application, the first step will be to set up Intake appointments with both parents. We do schedule both parties separately to avoid any conflict. We will request that certain documents be submitted during that appointment. Once all documents are submitted, the case is then reviewed and calculations are prepared. Our office does use a Shared Income Module when preparing cases. This simply means that we look at the situation as if both parents are living in the same household, what percentage of income the mother would bring to the household and what percentage the father would bring to the household. We then use those percentages to calculate the child support amount. Once child support calculations are prepared, the case is given to the Director to approve the child support calculations and recommendations. Once those are approved, the case is then forwarded to the Legal Advocate who will pursue the child support establishment. If both parties have cooperated thus far and can agree to the terms, then child support establishment can be done in office through a Stipulated Agreement which would be signed in agreement by both parties, then filed with the court for a Judge's review and if accepted, it will be signed and issued as an order by the Judge. If one or both parties do not agree to the terms, MATCSEO will pursue the same stipulations by filing a Petition with the court for a court hearing. Depending on the clients' cooperation, MATCSEO may decide to purse establishment directly by filing a petition with the court. The most important factor that influences the time it takes to process a case is the cooperation of both parents.

It might involve a prayer shawl or even lighting a candle, but it could be as simple as closing your eyes and allowing the Good Shepherd to lead you in silence for a moment or two.
