

KNOW ALL PERSONS BY THESE PRESENTS that pursuant to the power vested in me by the Revised Constitution of the Mescalero Apache Tribe and the Mescalero Apache Tribal Code, having declared a state of emergency on the Mescalero Apache Reservation at the request of the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council and in order to slow the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19), do HEREBY PROCLAIM that the following restrictions are implemented effective immediately and remain in effect until further notice, except as provided in Paragraph A below:

A. WEEKEND LOCKDOWN FROM OCTOBER 30TH TO NOVEMBER 2ND

From Friday, October 30th at 6:00 P.M. to Monday, November 2nd at 6:00 A.M. all persons shall remain at home under this weekend lockdown except as provided below:

- 1. A person may leave his or her home in the event of an emergency (defined as a serious, unexpected, or dangerous situation requiring immediate action, including a medical condition that requires immediate treatment) if that person is directly involved or affected by the emergency.
- 2. A person may tend to their own yards, gardens, pets, and livestock provided that where the person must tend to his or her livestock on land outside of his or her residential

assignment, then he or she must obtain prior approval from the President and the President may limit the hours and days such person may tend to his or her livestock.

- 3. A person does not have to remain indoors but must limit movement beyond the immediate area of his or her residence or residential assignment. This includes movement for exercise purposes.
- 4. One person from each residence may leave between 8:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. to dispose of trash at the nearest dumpster only.
- 5. Trick-or-treating and other Halloween events outside of a person's residence are strictly prohibited. Only virtual/on-line Halloween events are allowed.
- 6. This lockdown does not apply to an employee traveling to or from work or a contractor provided that such contractor complies with Paragraph (F) (3) below.

B. NO ENTRY INTO RESIDENCE WHERE NON-RESIDENT

A person may not enter a residence if he or she is not a regular resident of that residence.

C. <u>MASS GATHERINGS PROHIBITED</u>

Mass gatherings are prohibited. "Mass gathering" means any public or private gathering that brings together five (5) or more persons but does not include the presence of five (5) or more persons where those persons: 1) are in the residence where they regularly reside or 2) live together in the same residence and must travel in a single motor vehicle.

D. RESTRICTIONS FOR NOVEMBER 3RD/ELECTION DAY

Tents, shades, arbors, other temporary shelters, or parked vehicles set up by candidates for public office for the purpose of distributing food, campaign materials, or other goods are prohibited on election day, November 3rd. Additionally, candidates are prohibited from meeting with members of the public to solicit votes in any public place on that same date. However,

candidates may erect or post campaign signs or banners on parked vehicles or wooden or metal stands on that date provided that such signs comply with Section 1-5-2 of the Tribal Code.

E. INDOOR CHURCH SERVICES PROHIBITED

Indoor church services are prohibited. Church services may be conducted virtually/online or outside where all attendees remain in motor vehicles.

F. <u>VENDORS PROHIBITED</u>

Food stands/trucks/vendors are prohibited.

G. OUTSIDE VISITORS ALLOWED EXCEPT ON TRIBAL ROADS

- 1. Outside visitors to the Reservation are allowed on Highways 70 and 244 and Tribal Route 4 (from Highway 70 to the Reservation line at Carrizo Canyon Road).
- 2. All other Tribal roads (including BIA roads) are closed to outside visitors. The President may provide a limited exception for hunters participating in hunts offered by the Inn of the Mountain Gods.
- 3. "Outside visitor" means any person who does not reside on the Reservation *except* non-Resident Tribal members or affiliates, essential Reservation employees (while on duty only), Z-Trans employees (while on duty only), and U.S. Postal Service/Fed Ex/USPS workers (while delivering the mail/packages to the Reservation). The President may allow contractors to provide services on the Reservation where he determines that the risk to public health is not increased by allowing the same, the contractor agrees to follow all Tribal COVID-19 safety precautions, and the delay in the provision of services would be detrimental to public health or welfare.

BE IT FURTHER DECLARED that any person who shall violate any of the above restrictions may be subject to criminal penalty, pursuant to Section 10-16-10 (D) of the Tribal Code, or removal from the Reservation, in the case of non-Tribal Members; and Tribal

employees or employees of Tribal enterprises may be subject to disciplinary action including and up to termination.

BE IT FINALLY DECLARED that all other non-contrary provisions listed in Executive Orders 20-11 and 20-12 shall remain in full force and effect.
