Programs keep families in homes, students in school

PED urges NM families to apply for mortgage, rent, utility help

SANTA FE - The Public Education Department is urging eligible New Mexico families to apply for two programs to help pay the mortgage or rent and keep the lights on so children will not be uprooted from their local schools:

- The federal **Emergency Rental Assistance** program was created to reduce evictions or utility service cut-offs due to financial challenges related to the COVID-19

pandemic.

- The **New Mexico Homeowner Assistance Fund** offers grants of up to \$10,000 to maintain housing and reduce housing cost delinquency related to the pandemic.

"This has been an incredibly difficult year for so many New Mexico families that lost jobs or income due in one way or another to the pandemic," Public Education Secretary

Ryan Stewart said. "We owe it to our children to keep their families intact and in their homes so they can focus, as they should, on their education without fear of being suddenly uprooted."

Under the Emergency Rental Assistance program, the state of New Mexico is distributing nearly \$170 million to pay back, current or future rent and utility bills for eligible families.

Eligible households

may receive up to 15 months of assistance plus three additional months -- if funding is available -- to ensure housing stability. Assistance awards can be used for unpaid, current and future rent and utilities, although priority will be placed on paying past-due rent and utilities.

The Emergency Rental Assistance Program was established by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021. In New Mexico, the Department of Finance and Administration has been administering the program since April 5 in partnership with the City of Albuquerque.

Renters across the state are eligible for the program -- except for residents of Bernalillo and Doña Ana counties and those who live in a pueblo or tribal area. Those two counties, as well as tribal governments, will administer their own Rental Assistance Programs, which can be accessed through links at [RentHelpNM.org](https://renthelpnm.org).

An application for rental assistance may be submitted by either an eligible household or by a landlord on behalf of that eligible household. In general, funds will be paid directly to landlords and utility service pro-

viders. If a landlord does not wish to participate, funds may be paid directly to the eligible household.

Landlords and utility providers are encouraged to [download a W9](#) and submit it to the Department of Finance and Administration via ERAVendor.Relations@state.nm.us as soon as possible to ensure a streamlined process for receiving payment.

In addition, the [New Mexico Homeowner Assistance Fund](#) -- a \$1 million, six-month pilot program co-sponsored by the state and the New Mexico Mortgage Finance Authority -- was announced this week and is the first state program specifically for homeowners.

The assistance covers past-due and current mortgage payments for income-eligible New Mexicans who have experienced a financial hardship associated with the COVID-19 health crisis.

The New Mexico Homeowner Assistance Fund replaces the COVID-19 Homeowner Assistance Program, which also served homeowners with housing cost assistance payments. The Mortgage Finance Authority will make payments directly

to mortgage or loan servicers, escrow companies, or other housing providers. To be eligible for the program, household income must not exceed 100 percent of the area median income.

Applications can be made online at housingnm.org or by calling 505.308.4206 or toll-free 866.488.0498 to request a paper application.

Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

The Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) program will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands for those who need assistance.

Who is eligible for the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program?

A household is eligible if one member of the household:

Qualifies for the Lifeline program, including those that are on Medicaid, at

or below 135% of Federal Poverty Guidelines, or accept SNAP benefits; or

Receives benefits under the free and reduced-price school breakfast/lunch programs; or

Pell grant recipients; or

Those who have lost jobs or have seen their income reduced since February-2020, subject to certain income restrictions; or

Total 2020 income of household is at or below \$99,000 for single filers, or \$198,000 for joint fil-

ers; or

Meets eligibility criteria for a participating providers’ existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

When Can I Sign Up for the Benefit?

The program is scheduled to begin May 12, 2021, MATI customers will start signing up on this date. MATI will provide any necessary assistance in signing up for benefits.

**At the conclusion of the benefit, customers

will be subject to the provider’s rate, terms and conditions if the customer continues to subscribe to the broadband service.

We are in the early planning stages of safely returning back to opening the building. Some of the improvements include a new lobby area with additions to keep all of us safe. We are in the planning stage of building an outdoor patio complete with shaded areas and seating.

Our building now houses the CHR program which are servicing the community alongside our elderly program.

Hatchery News



We, at the fish hatchery, hope that you and your family have a safe and happy holiday.

The hatchery is now open for visitors and tours.

Our hours of operation are **M-F, 8-430 p.m.** **Call ahead for weekend hours (575-464-8768).**

The fish hatchery is a program run under the Mescalero Apache Tribe and the Southwest Tribal Fisheries Commission.

We have a staff of 7 on station, plus a Director. We hatch and raise rainbow trout.

At the facility, we have 16 inside tanks; 10 outside raceways with covered mesh canopies; 2 raceways within a metal Quonset building; and a separate building that holds 11 circular fish tanks.

With our doors now open to the public and as the summer begins, we invite you to come visit

the hatchery.

We have picnic tables available throughout the grounds.

While we are happy to be open again, we ask that all visitors follow COVID guidelines.

8 of the 16 concrete tanks in the tank house have been refurbished.

A new solar panel system was installed to cut down the cost of electricity use in the recirculation tank house.

In March we welcomed a new member to our staff.

Mr. Cloyce Salazar became our CDL fish truck driver.

The hatchery received results for the annual disease testing.

All fish on station are disease-free! Good job staff!

The hatchery received 200K trout eggs that were hatched in incubation trays.

For Earth Day, the staff did a clean-up at Firman Lake.

Firman is 1 of 4 water bodies on the reserva-

tion that the hatchery stocks with fish for tribal members.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 21-04

KNOW ALL PERSONS BY THESE PRESENTS that pursuant to the power vested in me by the Revised Constitution of the Mescalero Apache Tribe and the Mescalero Apache Tribal Code, having declared a state of emergency on the Mescalero Apache Reservation at the request of the Mescalero Apache Tribal Council and in order to slow the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19), do **HEREBY PROCLAIM** that the following COVID-19 safety provisions are made and implemented effective June 30, 2021, except as provided herein, and shall remain in effect until further notice:

A. GOVERNMENTAL OFFICES OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

All Tribal and other governmental offices shall be open to the public beginning on July 6, 2021, provided that the Tribe may require temperature checks and deny entry to any person with a fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or greater.

B. INDOOR CHURCH SERVICES ALLOWED AT FULL CAPACITY

Indoor services may resume at each church or other place of worship located within the exterior boundaries of the Mescalero Apache Reservation with no limitation on occupancy, provided that such church or other place of worship checks the temperature of each person entering the church or place of worship prior to entry and denies entry to individuals with a temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or greater.

C. FACE MASKS OPTIONAL FOR FULLY-VACCINATED; RESTRICTIONS CONTINUE FOR UNVACCINATED

Face Masks shall be optional for all persons who have been fully-vaccinated and for all persons, whether they are vaccinated or not, in outdoor public spaces. Any person who is not vaccinated must wear a Face Mask at mass gatherings, governmental offices, and any other indoor public space.


BE IT FURTHER DECLARED that all other provisions of Executive Order 21-03, not inconsistent with this Executive Order, remain in effect until further notice.

BE IT FINALLY DECLARED that any person who shall violate any of the above restrictions may be subject to: criminal penalty, pursuant to Section 10-16-10 (D) of the Tribal Code; disciplinary actions in the case of employees of the Mescalero Apache Tribe or any Tribal enterprise; or removal from the Reservation in the case of non-Tribal Members.







The behaviors listed below may be some of the signs that someone is thinking about suicide.

TALKING ABOUT:



- ▷ Wanting to die
- ▷ Great guilt or shame
- ▷ Being a burden to others

FEELING:



- ▷ Empty, hopeless, trapped, or having no reason to live
- ▷ Extremely sad, more anxious, agitated, or full of rage
- ▷ Unbearable emotional or physical pain

CHANGING BEHAVIOR, SUCH AS:



- ▷ Making a plan or researching ways to die
- ▷ Withdrawing from friends, saying good bye, giving away important items, or making a will
- ▷ Taking dangerous risks such as driving extremely fast
- ▷ Displaying extreme mood swings
- ▷ Eating or sleeping more or less
- ▷ Using drugs or alcohol more often
