Mescalero CHR Program Transportation Policy



TRANSPORTATION SCHEDULE

It is the policy of the Mescalero CHR Program to establish a transportation schedule and procedure as follows:

1. The designated days of transportation will be **Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.** CHR staff is not required to travel before 8:00 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m. . Closed on Holidays and Early Tribal Office Closures.
2. Pick up times will be scheduled for **8:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.** for patients living in the Palmer Loop,

Penn Scott, Carri-zo Trails, Windy Point and other areas on the east side of Apache Summit. The Mescalero community area will be scheduled at least **30 minutes** before the appointment time.

3. **Transportation appointments MUST be scheduled 24 hours before the date of appointment.**

Those patients who do not call in advance may be denied transportation if these scheduled times are full. Same Day and Last minute requests will be added **ONLY** if transportation is available. Patients should notify CHR staff immediately of any cancelled appointments. **Medication deliveries** will be scheduled on Mon-

day - Wednesday & Fridays so please plan accordingly for medication refills. Due to HIPPA - individuals will be picked up, taken to Pharmacy and returned home as scheduled. Patients should notify CHR immediately if they get their medication so their pick up time may go for someone else.

4. Changes will occur due to bad weather conditions, emergencies or early Tribal Office closure. **CHR staff will not transport patients to/from appointment(s) or medication pick-up in any bad weather.**

shall NOT:

- Transport any intoxicated person (s).
- Transport a minor child to the hospital or clinic without the presence of a parent or guardian.
- Pick up patient(s) who have their own transportation.
- Transport friends and other family members of patients without appointment(s).

NOTE: Person(s) that request transportation from CHR to the hospital who leave IHS or Behavioral Health to conduct personal business at another location, and then later return to the hospital requesting transportation home will be denied.

Call the CHR Office at **(575) 464-4054** to request transportation arrangements. If there is no answer, leave your name,

phone number, address, date/time of appointment and someone will call you back to confirm your pick up time.

Due to continuing abuse of CHR services, these changes have been made and can be amended at any time.

ALL RETURNING STUDENTS must update their current Enrollment Packet and bring in a current Physical if it was not done during the Child Find Fair, an updated Immunization


Record, a Notarized Medical Consent Form, and Income Verification for those that are considered to be “over-income”.

Documentation requirement for all new students:

Immunization Record, Birth Certificate, Certificate of Indian Blood (if applicable), Income Verification (TANF, SSI, 2 current check stubs, 2018 Income Tax), child’s Social Security Card, child’s Medicaid Card or other Health Insurance Card, Custody Papers (if applicable).




Male Involvement Activity

The Day Alone

Community is at the heart of what we do at Mescalero Reformed Church. Our mission statement specifies our desire to purposefully present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our community through living out the mandate to love God and love others. It permeates our worship, our prayers, our programs, our time at the Lord's Table and baptismal font, our education, and certainly our fellowship. Over and over, we remind ourselves that we were not made to be alone. Just like Adam was given Eve, so too are we given Christ and the Church to engage in community. However, there are times in the life of a Christian that are meant to be individual. In other words, the life of a Christian sits in this tension between individual and communal relationship with God. Let me try to explain.

One of my favorite authors is German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Bonhoeffer

shows the balance between individual and communal relationship with God through many of his books. One book in particular, entitled *Life Together*, Bonhoeffer has an entire chapter devoted to "The Day Alone." Throughout this chapter he explains solitude, silence, meditation, prayer, and intercession; all elements vital to the life of the Christian. But, rather than going down the trail for each of those items, let me simply share with you the introduction to the chapter:

"Many people seek fellowship because they are afraid to be alone. Because they cannot stand loneliness, they are driven to seek the company of other people. There are Christians, too, who cannot endure being alone, who have had some bad experiences with themselves, who hope they will gain some help in association with others. They are generally disappointed. Then

they blame the fellowship for what is really their own fault. The Christian community is not a spiritual hospital. The person who comes into a fellowship because they are running away from themselves is misusing it for the sake of diversion, no matter how spiritual this diversion may appear. They are really not seeking community at all, but only distraction which will allow them to forget their loneliness for a brief time, the very alienation that creates the deadly isolation of humankind."

Truthful and powerful words, but also words that are rather harsh and tough. Given our mission to build faith through community it seems appropriate (and important) to balance this community with an individual relationship with Christ. Though some might be terrified to be alone, it actually might be spiritually healthy to spend brief moments of solitude in prayer to God. Per-

haps the busyness and noise around us is making it difficult to hear what the Holy Spirit could whisper to you through silence and solitude (while also recognizing, some of us might be terrified of what the Holy Spirit might whisper). I hope and pray you find this balance between community and individual time with God. Time together is important and I thoroughly enjoy worshipping and spending time in fellowship with each and every one of you, but I also hope and pray we might have the courage to spend a moment, an hour, a morning, or maybe even a day alone with God.




