

Request Your Replacement Social Security Card Online

1. After signing in to your personal *my* Social Security account at www.ssa.gov/myaccount, select the “Replace your Social Security Card” link.

2. Next, verify your email address, select the location where your driver’s license or identification card was issued, and answer Yes or No to the background questions. If you are not making any other changes, then, select “Next.”

You can request a replacement Social Security card online if you:

- Are a U.S. citizen age 18 or older.
- Have a driver’s license or state-issued identification card from one of the participating states or the District of Columbia (to see if your state participates, go to www.ssa.gov/ssnumber).
- Have a U.S. mailing address (this includes APO, FPO, and DPO addresses).
- Have a *my* Social Security account.
- Don’t require changes to your name, date of birth, place of birth, or gender.
