# South-Central New Mexico - South Fork and Salt Fires

Issued by Wildland Fire Air Quality Response Program on June 22, 2024 at 06:55 AM MDT

## Fire


The South Fork Fire is 16,614 acres and 26% contained; The Salt Fire is 7,652 acres and 7% contained. Further information on each fire is available at inciweb.nwcg.gov.

A slow increase in the amount of sunshine each day may result in a slow increase in smoke production. For this weekend continue to expect the worst smoke impacts to be confined to locations adjacent to the fires, including Ruidoso, Ruidoso Downs, and far north Mescalero with MODERATE air quality and perhaps some brief worse conditions. Smoke may impact all areas of Mescalero and even to near Carrizozo Saturday evening, especially if showers or a storm develop near/east of the fires.

As winds turn slightly more southerly there is potential for MODERATE air quality and smoke impacts for Capitan for Sunday evening and overnight. Smoke may also flow further east along Highway 70 towards Hondo with at least MODERATE air quality conditions late Sunday. This pattern may continue early next week with smoke impacts from northern Mescalero and Ruidoso northward to Capitan and eastward towards Hondo.

### Showers/Storm Potential

The weather forecast continues to include at least a chance of showers and a storm this weekend and early next week. Any showers or storms could create gusty and erratic winds which could push smoke in any direction. Be alert to any changing weather conditions and remember if you smell smoke, you are breathing smoke.
